Hunger and food insecurities are a major issue here when minimum wage is \$9 a day. The family pictured above were having a get together to celebrate a Mexican holiday. Their "feast" consisted of a bowl of corn kernels and corn tortillas. They were overjoyed when we showed up with two dozen hotdogs- the leftovers from a expat cookout.

Fresh fruits and vegetables are not usually a part of a poor family's diet. We recently brokered a deal with a grower to get oranges in bulk for about 30 cents a pound. The smiles on the faces of the families receiving bags of oranges was priceless.
