Back-to-back hurricanes and some of the worst flooding in history can make ministry challenging, but it also gave us many new opportunities for ministry. Despite the horrific weather of the past month, we held our first children's Bible Festival, assisted several families displaced by flood waters, shared the Gospel with more than 100 children, and provided medical treatment to more than a dozen people.

We also gave out nearly 100 pieces of clothing and household items, distributed 500 meals, and logged almost 800 volunteer hours. With all this activity it is no wonder that people keep asking us if we really are "retired."

Our little church plant has been averaging about 45 people each week. However, we are now moving into the high season- when all our snowbirds from Canada and the U.S. return- so it was time to find a bigger place to meet. This is our fifth move in the last 2 years. The owner is generously letting us use her restaurant for free and allowing us to keep extra chairs in her storage room.

SEEING NEW NEEDS

As we continue to work with the ultra-poor in Mexico, God brings new needs to our attention. Almost every week, we are helping children to get medical attention for diseases caused by sleeping on dirt floors. These unsanitary conditions can cause pneumonia, disentary, parsitic infections, and skin diseases. Providing inexpensive hammocks is a quick solution, until the family can afford to lay cement. These families are always so grateful for even little things like this.



Upcoming Needs

1. The annual "Blessing in a Bag" drive begins this month. This children's Christmas program provides a bag of goodies (and the Gospel) to needy children. Our 2024 goal is to bless 200 children in Puerto Morelos with a special gift.
2. Two years ago, we provided Yamileht with a life-saving surgery. The strain of that tumor damaged one of her kidneys Today, she needs another surgery to repair a kidney that was damaged by the tumor.
